Round 13 is highlighted by the salivating match up between the Youth League 1 ladder leaders, with the Sunbury Jets taking on the Waverley Falcons. With results having finals implications, round 13 is poised to be sensational. The Supercats are starting to find their rhythm heading into the home stretch. After knocking off the Miners in round 12, Geelong showed they have a number of ways to beat teams. Supercats star Josiah King had a quiet game by his standards, Max Kos stepped up drilling six three-pointers in a 31-point performance. Corio Bay are clawing onto its final position, and a hiccup in round 12 against the Broncos has not done the Stingrays any favours with only seven games remaining. This match-up poses to be another test of the Stingrays resiliency. Another team on the cusp of the finals bubble is Camberwell. Sitting in the sixth and final place, the Dragons cannot misfire in round 13 against the challenging Miners. Ballarat played well above its record suggests in round 12, pushing both Hume City and Geelong to the edge. The Dragons cannot take this one lightly. Warrandyte and Casey are both on the outside looking into the finals window. The Venom pushed second placed Waverley all of the way in round 12, and Warrandyte will need this effort again to keep the Cavaliers at bay. The Hume City Broncos had a sensational double victory last round, knocking off the Stingrays and the Miners, two teams within the battle for sixth place. Christopher Alai was incredible with 18 points and 23 rebounds in the Saturday fixture, while Waays Hassan dominated on Sunday with a 26-point, 10-rebound and 6-assist masterclass. Look for both of them to have their way with the lowly Giants. In the game of the round, the second-placed Falcons host the undefeated Jets on their home court. Waverley has circled this rematch ever since Sunbury defeated them by two points in round 5. On Saturday, they get their chance for revenge. But to have any chance, Waverley will need to have the best game of its season. The Jets have been incredible in season 2018, winning 17 straight games with a winning margin of 15.1 points per game. This one is going to be a cracker. Werribee get the rest day Saturday, and then on Sunday welcome the Stingrays to Eagle Stadium where they are 6-2. A win can all but assure the Devils of a top-3 finish, look for Danaeili Herbert to continue his awesome recent play against Corio Bay. Sunbury backs up on the Sunday against the Braves. Bendigo had a great round 12 winning both games, and depending how gassed the Jets are after the big Saturday fixture, this one has the potential for upset written all over it. Casey has a great chance to complete the round sweep hosting the Giants on Sunday afternoon. The Cavaliers have benefited from the outstanding recent play of Oyiti Amum who has averaged 19.7 points and nine rebounds a contest over his last three games. Amum should continue this hot play against the bottom-placed Coburg. Warrandyte will be looking to square the ledger against the Geelong Supercats on Sunday. After losing to the Supercats by nine points on their homecourt in round 8, the Venom will need to play at their very best to limit the impact of Geelong stars Wang Nyieth and Josiah King. Waverley back up on Sunday afternoon travelling to MARS to take on the Ballarat Miners, for the Falcons they hope a victory will mean a clean sweep on the weekend. We shall wait and see.

STATE CHAMPIONSHIP MEN

Corio Bay will try to rebound from last week's horror show against Eltham. The Stingrays are on an 11-game skid and are two wins behind their nearest opposition at the bottom of the standings. The 'Cats, meanwhile, are sitting in third and eyeing off the top two with Waverley faltering in Round 12.

Hume City will hunt an upset win when they battle Ringwood. The Broncos struggled without star import Mike Rose last weekend, so whether he plays will have a big bearing on how they fare against the Hawks juggernaut. That said, Ringwood are extremely tough to match up on and will be looking to extend their five-game winning streak and further cement their spot on top of the ladder.

Casey will look to climb into the top six when they tackle McKinnon. The Cavs have been great at home this year, holding a 5-2 record in their own gym, and will try to make it five wins in six starts against the Cougars, who have won two straight after a run of losses saw them tumble down the standings. A finals spot could well be on the line here so it will be game on.

Blackburn hits the court fresh from their massive upset win over Waverley when they tackle Hawthorn. The Vikings broke their road duck with a stunning win over the Falcons last week and return home as they look to build. Standing in their way are the high-flying Magic, who sit fourth with a 9-5 record and will be looking to lock-down a finals spot with a win.

Waverley will try to put a horror week behind them when they face Knox. Ordinarily this would be game of the round but both sides are coming off below-par Round 12 efforts, with the Falcons dropping two games and the Raiders also suffering defeat. The loser of this game could see their playoffs spot suddenly in jeopardy.

McKinnon backs up on Sunday when they welcome Keilor. The Thunder sit at 4-10 but have not been out of place in the top flight, while the Cougars may well need to win this game to be in the top six at round's end. The Cougars have been hard to beat at home despite their mid-season struggles and will start warm favourites.

Eltham hosts Casey in an important match for both sides, but for different reasons. The 'Cats will want to grab a victory to potentially climb back into the top two by the end of the weekend, while the Cavs are eyeing a top six spot with a road win. Eltham's home form hasn't been fantastic so the visitors will go in with a sniff. Expect a tough, physical game that could go down to the wire.

Werribee rounds out the weekend by hosting Corio Bay. The Devils have endured a disappointing season but have played free-flowing basketball, which could mean a big score is on the cards against the hapless Stingrays. That said, if the visitors can find some sort of spark and hang in the contest it will be a lot closer than form suggests.

Corio Bay vs Eltham

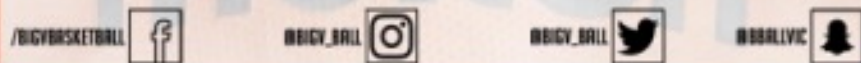
