Staging an event like this requires support from many people and organisations. To our Executive Committee members, staff and our many volunteers thanks for all your assistance in the preparation and management of the event.



MERV EMMS TROPHY HONOURS

As a revered and respected coach known also for his outstanding work as an official, administrator and lifelong volunteer of basketball, Merv Emms' name is deservedly etched upon the Australian Under-18 Men's Championship trophy.

Emms' role as a technical official took him to the 1956 Melbourne Olympic Games and he was a major contributor in the design of the Alexandria Basketball Stadium in 1967.

As a coach, he led teams to an astonishing seven national junior titles, including the first ever Australian Under-18 Championship in 1954.

His involvement in NSW Country basketball and throughout the Oceania region made him a much-respected figure and saw Emms named as a Member of Honour of Oceania Basketball.

In November 2000, prior to his passing, Emms was honoured with the presentation of Life Membership of Basketball NSW and a Government Sports Medal for his contribution to the sport. Emms was an Australian basketball pioneer, paving the way for many of Australia's most promising young basketballers and for the sport itself.

MAREE JACKSON TROPHY HONOURS

When the victorious women's team at the Australian Under-18 Junior Championships accepts the trophy, they will do so in honour of a pioneer of Australian basketball in Maree Jackson.

Winning two Under-18 Championships in 1971 and 1972, Jackson's performances helped her earned a scholarship at Louisiana State. Accepting the offer, she became the first Australian female basketballer to head to a US college, paving the way for future generations.

Jackson went on to become one of the most revered female Australian basketballers on the international hardwood, combining an imposing presence in the paint and an unrelenting determination to win with a soft touch around the basket.

She played 30 games for the Opals between 1975-1979 including two

World Championships and three Oceania Championships, helping Australia to qualify for the 1980 Olympics.

She was a member of the groundbreaking 1979 Opals outfit that finished fourth at the World Championships which was the best finish for any Australian senior national team to that point.

Jackson continued to contribute to the game in retirement as the mother of Australian superstar Lauren Jackson and in 2006, her achievements were honoured with induction into the Australian Basketball Hall of Fame.

LUC LONGLEY FAIR PLAY AWARD

First presented in 2004 at the Under 14's National Championships, Fair Play Awards recognise teams that display outstanding sportsmanship – with the inaugural awards named after Australian Olympians Andrew Gaze and Jenny Cheesman.

Since 2013, the Fair Play Award at the Under 18 Australian Junior Championships has been named after Australian basketball legend Luc Longley.

Longley – a household name across the globe – was the first Australian to play in the NBA, winning three titles with the Chicago Bulls alongside Michael Jordan, Scottie Pippen, Toni Kukoc and Dennis Rodman. Longley was inducted into the Australian Basketball Hall of Fame in 2006, followed by the Sport Australia Hall of Fame in 2009. He played for Australia as a junior in 1987 and was on the first WA team to win an U17 Australian Junior Championship.

Longley attended the AIS and then went to college in the USA before being drafted into the NBA where he won Championships with the Bulls in 1996, 1997 and 1998.

Longley represented Australia at the 1988 Olympics as a 17 year old; and then again at the 1992 and 2000 Olympics and two World Championships.
